Targets for 2016

Against NMS

- Reading Target is 100% above NMS (Yr 3 achieved 97.8% in 2015; Yr 5 achieved 98.1% in 2015)
- Writing Target is 100% above NMS (Yr 3 achieved 99.3% in 2015; Yr 5 achieved 95.4% in 2015)
- Spelling Target is 100% above NMS (Yr 3 achieved 98.6% in 2015; Yr 5 achieved 98.1% in 2015)
- Grammar and Punctuation Target is 100% above NMS (Yr 3 achieved 97.8% in 2015; Yr 5 achieved 99.1% in 2015)
- Numeracy Target is 100% above NMS (Yr 3 achieved 100% in 2015; Yr 5 achieved 98.1% in 2015)

Against U2Bs

- Reading: Yr 3 – 75% (from 67.9% in 2015) Yr 5 – 70% (from 60.7% in 2015)
- Writing: Yr 3 – 65% (from 58.0% in 2015) Yr 5 – 50% (from 35.2% in 2015)
- Spelling: Yr 3 – 60% (from 47.8% in 2015) Yr 5 – 60% (from 47.7% in 2015)
- Grammar and Punctuation: Yr 3 – 60% (from 49.3% in 2015) Yr 5 – 70% (from 63.9% in 2015)
- Numeracy: Yr 3 – 60% (from 49.3% in 2015) Yr 5 – 70% (from 63.9% in 2015)

Domain wide goal is to maintain the percentages in the lowest tow band to $\leq 5\%$

Our initiatives include

- Target phonological awareness in prep with “Read It Again” and continue implementation of synthetic phonics in Prep and Year 1.
- Continue gross motor skills program.
- Continue to apply pedagogy framed by the Gradual Release of Responsibility (Fisher, D., & Frey, N., 2014)
- Target learning in different bands using differentiated data supported strategies.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Continue coaching and mentoring processes in line with school curriculum priorities.
- Support literacy program enhancement with:
 - Writing workshops with Gifted Education Mentor and visiting authors.
 - Hire of literacy aides to aid in differentiated curriculum delivery.
 - Purchase resources to support school goals in priority curriculum areas.
